## India rolls out its nationwide COV-ID- 19 vaccination drive

yonchhen Dr Lotay Tshering congratulated the Indian counterpart Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the people of India for the landmark launch of nationwide COVID-19 vaccination drive yesterday.

Lyonchhen said India's pursuit of securing and distributing the vaccine of such an impressive magnitude is an indication of PM Modi's display of profound and compassionate leadership in the Indian subcontinent.

The Prime Minister said: "We hope it comes as an answer to pacify all the sufferings we have endured during this pandemic. We send prayers for the good health and well being of Your Excellency (PM Narendra Modi) and the people of India."

Thanking the Prime Minister of Bhutan PM Modi tweeted that a vaccine which was earlier believed to be impossible in such a short period has now become a reality.

PM Modi also thanked the efforts of the scientists, doctors and innovators.

As India kicked-off its ambitious drive, a sanitation worker became the first Indian to receive the Covid vaccine as the country began the world's largest inoculation drive

yesterday.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the programme, which aims to vaccinate more than 1.3 billion people against the Covid. The Indian premier also paid tribute to front-line workers who will be the first to receive the jabs.

"We are launching the world's biggest vaccination drive and it shows the world of our capability," PM Modi, said, addressing the country during the launch.

India has recorded the

second-highest number of Covid-19 infections in the world after the United States.

Millions of doses of two approved vaccines - Covishield and Covaxin - were shipped across the country in the days leading up to the start of the drive.

Meanwhile, as Bhutan eagerly awaits the vaccine to arrive home the country as of yesterday recorded 842 cases of Covid-19 with 288 active cases while 553 cases has been declared as recovered and only one death reported thus far.
